## Same Services but Delivered Differently

The Shire of Corrigin and Community Resource Centre have closed the front doors but remain open for business. We will continue to deliver critical services and business as usual wherever possible.

In the short term we are taking advice from the Department of Health and government on further actions to reduce the spread of COVID-19. We have already started working the medium and longer term goals of getting services back on track once the pandemic has been controlled.

The way we do business has changed and most of our administration staff are now working from home. Our phones have been diverted and you can still call and we will be happy to help you complete transactions over the phone, by email or internet including:

- · Dog and cat registrations
- · Rates payments
- · Library services
- Transwa bus ticket bookings

Shire buildings have been closed to the public including: Corrigin Recreation and Events Centre, pool and heated pool, CWA and halls. No community bus bookings will be made until further notice. All playgrounds and skate park are also closed.

The outside staff will continue to work on road, building and town maintenance while observing additional hygiene, social distancing and restricting vehicles to one person.

## Budget 2020-2021

Council invites written submissions from community Clubs and Groups for consideration in this year's Shire Budget.



### A reminder to community members, clubs and groups that the 2020-21 Shire Budget is now being formulated.

• Submissions will need to clearly explain what is sought, accurately define the cost to Council and advise the in-kind or cash contribution from the Shire and/or community club or group, for the project proposal.

• Submissions from community clubs and groups must be in writing, addressed to the CEO and be received by 4.30pm on Thursday 30 April 2020.

• Outcomes of community budget requests will be available for applicants after the Shire of Corrigin 2020-2021 Budget has been passed in July 2020.

Whilst all requests will be considered during the Budget process, Council will be mindful that any additional projects, are those reasonably reflected in the Strategic Community Plan 2017-2027 and will be a sound use of public funds.

#### DFES STATE WIDE EXTENSION ON RESTRICTED BURNING TIMES

The Fire and Emergency Services Commissioner has extended all restricted burning times across Western Australia until the end of April 2020.

This extension will come into effect on Wednesday 1 April 2020 and will be reviewed again before the end of April.

This approach has come about to reduce the Covid-19 risk to firefighters and the actions that shires are undertaking with greater controls on the issuing of permits.

## SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION

#### Stevenson Scholarship for Further Education <u>APPLICATIONS</u> NOW OPEN

The Stevenson Scholarship was established by the late Edna Stevenson (a former resident of the Shire of Corrigin) to promote and advance the education of the residents of the Shire of Corrigin. Stevenson Scholarships are administered by the Trustees of the Edna Stevenson Trust.

#### Eligibility

Stevenson Scholarships are available to students who are residents of the Shire of Corrigin and/or whose parents or guardians are not able to provide sufficient financial assistance for the student to achieve a tertiary education.

#### **Resident Status**

Residents are defined as:

(a) A person residing in the Shire of Corrigin at the time of applying for the Stevenson Scholarship.

(b) A former resident of the Shire of Corrigin (of not more than two years absence) who was a student at a school in the Shire of Corrigin for at least three years whose immediate family resides in Corrigin.

#### **Student Status**

Students must be enrolled in and attending any of the following: (a) Corrigin District High School

- (b) Any government run senior high
- school in Western Australia
- (c) An agricultural high school or college in Western Australia
- (d) A TAFE college in Western Australia
- (e) A university in Western Australia

#### Scholarships

Scholarships provide financial assistance to help cover the costs of text books, enrolment fees and course fees at approved educational institutions. The following amounts are indicative only, lesser or greater amounts may be awarded depending on the course of study and financial need:

- SECONDARY STUDY up to \$2,000
- TERTIARY STUDY up to \$5,000

Scholarships are awarded for one year periods. Scholarship recipients may apply for further scholarships on a year by year basis.

Applications need to be submitted one (1) week prior to the meeting date to be considered within the agenda of that meeting. Late applications will be considered at the next meeting.

### Non-essential travel between WA regions will be restricted

#### Starts midnight, Tuesday 31/03/2020

Western Australians will not be permitted to leave their regional boundary. (Due to their close proximity, the Perth and Peel regions will combine into one region. Other regions are South-West, Great Southern, Goldfields-Esperance, Mid-West, Wheatbelt, Gascoyne, Pilbara and Kimberley.) Police have the power to enforce these restrictions if necessary, and fines of up to \$50,000 can be issued.

Exemptions will apply in circumstances including employment purposes; medical or veterinary reasons; delivery of essential services including health or emergency services; people living across regional boundaries, who may not have access to groceries or supplies immediately within their region; transport of goods; compassionate grounds; a family member has primary care responsibilities; for school, TAFE or tertiary study reasons; to escape domestic violence or due to an emergency.
