# Know your Councillors...

upgrade, including the helicopter landing area and patient transfer facility; the Medical Centre upgrade; the swimming pool upgrade including the hydrotherapy pool; and of course the Corrigin Recreation and Events Centre, amongst other things.

I represent Council on the Central Country Zone, Wheatbelt South Regional Road Group (Chair), RoeROC, Wheatbelt South Aged Housing Alliance and other organisations, all for the betterment of our community.

During my 13 years on Council I have been lucky enough to work with some great Councillors and staff at the Shire of Corrigin. Our current crop of Councillors is hard-working, insightful and determined to do their best to keep Corrigin a vibrant and viable community which is welcoming and a home of choice for young and old. While we are a small organisation, we have some fantastic staff, ably lead by Rob Paull, who also do their very best to carry out Council's strategic directions.
