

PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT ACT 2005

TOWN PLANNING SCHEME AMENDMENT AVAILABLE FOR INSPECTION

SHIRE OF CORRIGIN LOCAL PLANNING SCHEME No.2, AMENDMENT No. 4

Notice is hereby given that the Shire of Corrigin has prepared the abovementioned town planning scheme amendment for the following purpose:

To reclassify the northern portion of Lot 53 Kunjin Street (corner Corrigin-Kondinin Road), Corrigin comprising an area of approximately 5.69 hectares from 'Rural Residential' zone to 'Special Use' zone.

Amending Schedule 3 - Special Use Zones of the Scheme Text by adding Special Use No.9 Development Standards/Conditions.

Amending Schedule No.1 – Interpretations of the Scheme Text by

adding the following definition:

"Agricultural Machinery Display, Sales & Repairs – Means land and buildings used for the display, sale, maintenance and mechanical repair of new and second-hand agricultural/farming equipment, machinery and vehicles".

Amend the Scheme Map in accordance with the Scheme Amendment Map.

Documents and plans setting out and explaining the scheme amendment proposal have been deposited at the Shire of Corrigin Administration Centre, 9 Lynch Street, Corrigin and at the Western Australian Planning Commission, Gordon Stephenson House, 140 William Street, Perth and will be available for public inspection during office hours up to and including 15 May 2017.

If your club does not have an ABN because it is a school sports club, or another large organisation such as Special Olympics Australia, you can still apply. To apply you need to include the ABN for the organisation to which your club belong, in the relevant questions, provide us with the details of the revenues for your club, not for the entire school, organisation or entity and include the contact details of a key contact at the school, organisation or entity in the Secondary Contact details fields.

Hosted by the Shire of Corrigin, this special business after hours will share an insight into the role of the OECD, public policies and their outlook

Brian is returning to Australia for a Global Heads of Mission meeting in Canberra with the Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade. This evening will provide him with an opportunity for constructive discussion on Australian policy. Brian will also share the successes and challenges in the role as Australian delegate.

Established in 1961 in Paris, the OECD provides a forum in which governments can work together to share experiences and seek solutions to common problems. The OECD measures productivity and global flows of trade and investment; it analyses and compares data to predict future trends. The OECD also sets international standards on a wide range of things, from agriculture and tax to the safety of chemicals. In addition, the OECD looks at issues that directly affect everyone's daily life, like how much people pay in taxes and social security, how much leisure time they can take, it also undertakes extensive work to identify how different countries' school systems are readying their young people for modern life.
