MAY COUNCIL DECISIONS

COMMUNITY ASSISTANCE PROGRAM 2026/2027

A range of local community groups and projects will receive funding and in kind support under the 2026/2027 Community Assistance Program, subject to final budget adoption. Support approved by Council includes funding for museum facility upgrades, community shed safety improvements, traffic management assistance for the Corrigin Triathlon and sponsorship for the 103rd Corrigin Agricultural Show. Additional support includes community bus hire fee waivers, Containers for Change collection bins and provision for future community donation requests during the financial year.

BUSINESS ASSISTANCE GRANT

Council received an application under the Business Assistance Grant Program seeking \$500 in funding to assist with the installation of CCTV cameras at a local business premises.

The application was considered by Council, however it was not approved as the proposed project did not meet the intent and criteria of the Business Assistance Grant Program, particularly in relation to delivering broader community-wide benefits and improvements.

CORRIGIN DOG CEMETERY

Council confirmed the requirement for all burials at the Corrigin Dog Cemetery to be approved and arranged through the shire and resolved not to discount the fees for consistency. Council will review the fees as part of the 2026/27 budget process.

A draft Corrigin Dog Cemetery Management and Burial Policy, and Guidelines was endorsed for public advertising. The proposed policy is intended to provide clearer guidance around burials, memorials, maintenance responsibilities and general use of the cemetery, helping support the long term management of the site as both a community asset and local tourism attraction.

PERFORMANCE BASED STANDARDS VEHICLE ACCESS

Council has supported an application from Main Roads WA for a specific Performance Based Standards (PBS) heavy vehicle to access the Liberty fuel depot via Boyd Street from Brookton Highway. The proposal is expected to improve freight efficiency and reduce overall truck movements while maintaining controlled access arrangements. Council did not support broader network access upgrades due to concerns about protecting local roads from additional wear and tear.

SHIRE UPDATES



ROADWORKS UPDATE

Maintenance grading has continued across a number of roads, including Jubuk South Road, Yealering–Kulin Road, Hovell Road, Bartlett Road, Bullaring–Gorge Rock Road and Hartley Road. Gravel carting has also been undertaken on Jubuk South Road.

Guideposts have been installed along Drywell Road to improve road safety, and maintenance works have been completed on the Kurenkuten Bridge, including the installation of reflectors.



TOWN CREW UPDATE

The town crew has been busy carrying out a range of works around town, including mowing, spraying, leaf raking, line marking and tree trimming.

General clean-up and routine maintenance has been completed at the Cemetery to keep the area neat and well presented.

Maintenance works have also been carried out at O'Shea Place public toilets, including repairs to a damaged roof.

Three new fire pits with BBQ grill plates have recently been installed at Gorge Rock, providing an improved space for visitors and campers to gather and enjoy the area.

The Corrigin Library received a State Library Technology and Digital Inclusion Grant to purchase a new photo printer, replacing and upgrading the old machine to provide a more reliable service for the community.

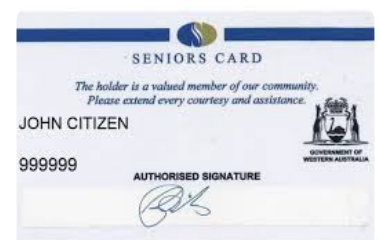

This scheme provides concessions to eligible pensioners and seniors in relation to local government rates charges, water service charges, emergency services levy, and underground electricity connection charges. The Water Corporation will register you as an eligible pensioner or senior and notify your Local Government, even if you do not have a Water Corporation account.
