SUPERANNUATION FOR COUNCIL MEMBERS

Council has decided not to increase sitting fees or member allowances this year. Councillors will now receive superannuation contributions as per the Salaries and Allowances Tribunal decision as this change may help encourage more people to nominate for Council in future elections, and Councillors can choose to opt out by writing to the CEO.

RATES EXEMPTION 1922 & YOU INC.

A rates exemption was approved for 1922 & You for the property on Walton Street, with the condition that it is reviewed annually. Council is impressed by the events and programs being run and is pleased to support the group as they continue to bring the community together.

PROPOSED CHANGES TO CROWN RESERVE 29118 – 8 GOYDER STREET (LOT 12)

A request will be sent to the State to update the designated purpose of 8 Goyder Street (home of the Containers for Change shed) to allow the property to be leased. If approved, expressions of interest will be sought from people who may be interested in running the facility as a small business.

COUNCIL PLAN 2025-2035

The draft Council Plan, which combines the Strategic Community Plan and Corporate Business Plan, has been endorsed and is available for public comment. The document sets out the Shire's goals and priorities for the next ten years. Following feedback from the community, the Council Plan will go to the August meeting for final adoption.

ADOPTION OF THE 2025/2026 BUDGET

Council has adopted the 2025/2026 Budget, which outlines how the Shire plans to manage it's money over the next year. It includes what we expect to earn and spend, and how funds will be used for roads, infrastructure, services, and local The budget programs. also confirms this year's rates, bin charges, councillor payments, and the threshold for reporting material budget variations. It helps Council plan ahead and use community resources wisely.


