NOVEMBER COUNCIL DECISIONS

APPLICATION TO KEEP THREE DOGS

An application to keep three dogs at a residence has been approved. This special approval comes with a few conditions to ensure the pets are safe and well cared for. The conditions also require that the dogs' registrations remain up to date.

DELEGATED AUTHORITY - GRANT EXEMPTION AS TO NUMBER OF DOGS KEPT AT PREMESIS

Council has introduced a new delegation that allows the Chief Executive Officer (CEO) to grant exemptions for people wanting to keep more than two dogs on their property. This means that applications no longer need to wait for a Council Meeting and can be approved directly by the CEO, as long as certain conditions are met.

REPORT TO COUNCIL - SENIOR DESIGNATED EMPLOYEE

The CEO has provided Council with news that Myra Henry has been appointed as the new Deputy Chief Executive Officer (DCEO) for the Shire of Corrigin. Myra, who is coming from the Shire of Coorow, will begin her role in the new year.

OFFER TO PURCHASE LOT 27 & 28 GRANITE RISE ESTATE

Two offers for properties in the Granite Rise Estate have been accepted. After a period of public notice, the CEO will move forward with completing the sales on behalf of the Shire.

SELLING AGENCY AGREEMENT FOR VACANT LAND

The contract to sell the shire's vacant land had expired and Council has accepted a proposal from Nutrien Harcourts to continue to act as the exclusive agent for selling vacant land within the Shire, including Granite Rise Estate. This contract will last for three years.

VACANT LAND - RESERVE VALUES

Following recent asset valuations, Council has set reserve prices for vacant land across the Shire of Corrigin. These prices will help guide future land sales.

DEVELOPMENT APPLICATION - VARIOUS ALTERATIONS & ADDITIONS TO CBH FACILITY IN BULYEE

Council has approved a development application from Cooperative Bulk Handling Limited (CBH) for some changes to their existing grain handling and storage facility in Bulyee. This includes various alterations and additions to the facility located on Lot 3 and Lot 22 Bulyee Road. A few conditions and advice notes have been attached to ensure the development goes smoothly.
