JUNE COUNCIL DECISIONS

DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORT LICENCING AGREEMENT

Local licensing services at the Shire office are secured for another five years through a fresh agreement running until 2031. This continuation ensures our community retains a convenient, close-to-home avenue to complete all of their vehicle and transport licensing transaction needs.

2025/2026 BUDGET AMENDMENTS

Stronger than expected land sales at the Granite Rise subdivision have boosted our budget revenue. These extra funds, along with their associated settlement costs, have been formally incorporated into our year-end financials. To support long-term growth, the profits are being allocated to our Land Subdivision Reserve to help fund future community developments.

CBH DEVELOPMENT APPLICATION

Conditional approval has been granted for a new 1,398-square-meter solar array at the Cooperative Bulk Handling (CBH) facility on Corrigin South Road. The low-reflectivity project will help lower operational costs for the vital local grain handling hub, with clear conditions in place to seamlessly integrate stormwater management with existing site infrastructure.

DISABILITY ACCESS AND INCLUSION PLAN – ANNUAL REPORT AND IMPLEMENTATION PLAN

Our latest access and inclusion report shows steady progress in making our public spaces welcoming to everyone. Looking ahead to the next twelve months, we are focusing on improving local access to information, delivering disability awareness training, and continuing to upgrade our public buildings and facilities.

COUNCIL PLAN 2025-2035 - ANNUAL REVIEW

The Council Plan was reviewed to display the current status of actions taken. This progress check ensures that our ongoing projects and community actions remain on target, keeping the communities long-term vision firmly aligned with our current budget and resources.

REVIEW AND CONTINUATION OF BUILDING SERVICES

The successful partnership with the City of Kalamunda for building surveyor services will continue for another three years. This shared services arrangement is working well, and the City of Kalamunda team will continue to support our residents and staff with the processing of and advice for all local building applications.

ROE TOURISM ASSOCIATION – MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

We have extended our regional partnership with the Roe Tourism Association through to 2029 to keep drawing visitors to our region. Working closely with seven neighbouring shires helps us collaboratively market regional attractions, drive local economic activity, and promote popular self-drive routes like the Pathways to Wave Rock.

CENTRAL AGCARE INC – 48 KIRKWOOD STREET

We are finalising a piece of local history by transferring the land title at 48 Kirkwood Street to Central Agcare Inc. The property was originally held in the Shire's name as security for a community loan. With those funds fully paid back by the organisation, we are pleased to officially hand over the title to support their continued community service work.

POLICY REVIEWS

A targeted review of our policy register was undertaken to address new legislative requirements and strengthen our financial management. This included upgrading our framework to ensure full compliance with upcoming state data privacy legislation, adopting a new policy for financial assistance programs, and tightening internal controls around asset accounting and equipment disposals.

CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER – ANNUAL REVIEW OF PERFORMANCE

Our annual performance review for the Chief Executive Officer has been conducted to evaluate leadership milestones over the past year. In addition to reviewing past performance, Key Performance Indicators (KPIs) have been established for the coming year to ensure executive goals remain firmly aligned with Council's strategic planning.

DELEGATION REGISTER REVIEW

Our annual Delegation Register review ensures our day-to-day operations remain efficient and fully aligned with modern local government standards. Updates this year include removing outdated administrative layers for committees and smoothly expanding options for simple, short-term lease extensions under two years.

WORKS UPDATE

OUTSIDE CREW

Maintenance grading works have continued across a number of roads, including Corrigin South Road, Corrigin-Wogerlin Road, Bilbarin-Quairading Road, Copestakes Road and Drywell Road.

Verge clearing is continuing on Copestakes Road and Szczecinski Road. The patching truck has been repairing potholes and road edges around town, as well as on Quairading Road and Wickepin-Yealering Road.

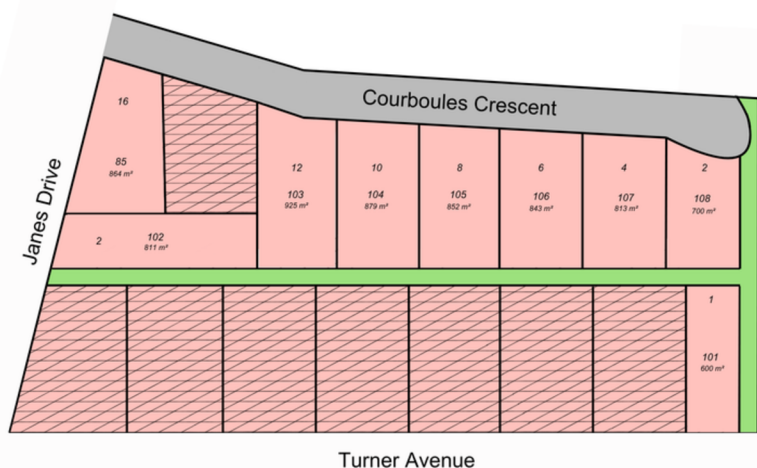
