

# APRIL COUNCIL DECISIONS



#### **BUSH FIRE ADVISORY COMMITTEE MEETING RECOMMENDATIONS**

Council has endorsed the Bush Fire Advisory Committee's recommendations for the 2025/26 season. Greg Evans has been appointed Chief Bush Fire Control Officer, with Steven Bolt as Deputy. A number of local volunteers have been confirmed as Bush Fire Control Officers across the various brigades, and Fire Weather Officers have been appointed for each region of the Shire. Council also confirmed authorised officers for issuing harvest bans and named Jason Carrall as the Training Officer. Dual Fire Control Officers have been appointed for coordination with neighbouring shires. Additionally, the 2025/26 Firebreak Order was formally adopted.

#### AVON WASTE CONTRACT EXTENSION

Council has approved a contract extension with Avon Waste for waste and recycling collection services. The agreement allows for three additional one-year terms, meaning services will continue under the current provider until 30 June 2028.

#### RESIGNATION OF CR BROOKE FILINSKI

Council has acknowledged the resignation of Cr Brooke Filinski, effective from 18 March 2025. A formal thank you was extended by the Shire President, Deputy President, and fellow Councillors in appreciation of Brooke's time and contributions to Council. Subject to approval from the Electoral Commissioner, Council has resolved not to fill the vacant position, with the next local government elections scheduled for October 2025.

#### SALE OF FORMER INFANT HEALTH CENTRE

The Shire of Corrigin will soon be advertising the former Infant Health Centre for sale, offering a great opportunity for local investment and business development. With no future Shire use planned, Council aims to sell the property - zoned for commercial use - to unlock funds for other community projects. #### **AUDIT AND RISK MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE CHAIR**

The Shire of Corrigin is seeking to appoint an Independent Chairperson to the Audit, Risk and Improvement Committee in preparation for new legislative requirements across Western Australian local governments. This paid role involves approximately four meetings per year held in the Shire of Corrigin Council Chambers, though flexibility with electronic meetings will be considered where necessary.

Meetings are typically held on the second Tuesday each March, June, September and December, with occasional special meetings and/or workshops as required.

The committee plays a key role in reviewing and making recommendations to Council on matters such as financial management, risk oversight, internal controls, legislative compliance, and audit planning and reporting. A background in local government, finance, risk, or governance would be ideal.



You may be eligible for a State Government funded Rate Rebate under the provisions of the Rates and Charges (Rebates & Deferments) Act 1992 if you are the owner and occupier of that property on the 1<sup>st</sup> July each financial year.

The eligibility date will be that of your application lodgement date with the Water Corporation and can not be back dated.
