Building and Planning Permits

Working out if you need a building or planning permit can be tricky. If you are not sure if a development application or building permit is needed, please contact the shire office for help.

Planning – is about the land use and details can be found at <u>Shire</u> of <u>Corrigin planning information</u> (www.wa.gov.au)

The Town Planning Scheme sets out the permitted, discretionary and excluded activities on the land and is divided into the following zones:

- Residential Zone
- Commercial Zone
- General Industry Zone
- Rural Zone
- Rural Residential Zone

Building – is about the structural integrity of any building.

A building permit is needed before you do any building work including new construction, renovations, or extensions of existing buildings, regardless of how minor the building work is unless otherwise exempted. Temporary buildings that will be on site for less than one month do not need building permit.

Some kinds of building work do not need a building permit including small garden sheds, temporary site sheds, some fences (other than a fence as part of a private swimming pool enclosure), certain masts and antennas, small retaining walls, small pergolas and the like.

A building permit is not required for Class 10 buildings or incidental structures in the Shire of Corrigin (any many other shires) outside the townsite. This means that Class 10 buildings on farms do not require a building permit including non-habitable buildings or structures such as a private garage, carport or shed.

Septic tank approvals and demolitions are separate processes and involve the Environmental Health Officer.

JULY 2023 COUNCIL DECISIONS

GRANITE RISE ESTATE

Offers have been received for two of the larger lots in the Granite Rise Estate. The sale is subject to a period of advertising as required by the Local Government Act. Council has accepted offers on three of the larger lots in the estate this year and is looking forward to further sales in the coming year.

LOCAL ROADS AND COMMUNITY INFASTRUCTURE PROGRAM PHASE 4

In 2020 the Australian Government announced new funding for the Local Roads and Community Infrastructure Program (LRCIP). Eligible projects include construction, maintenance and improvements to council assets that are open to the public. The upgrade to the Corrigin Medical and Wellness Centre and replacing the airstrip lights were decided as the most important projects for the funding.

BUDGET ADOPTION 2023/2024

Council adopted the 2023/2024 budget and 2023/2024 Schedule of Fees and Charges, these documents can be found on the website www.corrigin.wa.gov.au

The budget has been prepared with the following key points:

- 4.0% rate revenue increase
- Rubbish charges increased by \$22 per service
- · Fees and charges increased in alignment with the cost of goods and services

The capital and road project budget for 2023/2024 includes:

- Land and building upgrades \$580,000
- Furniture and equipment \$79,746
- Plant and equipment \$2,391,793 (including plant purchases from previous years still awaiting delivery)
- Parks, ovals and other infrastructure \$347,000

Grant funding expected in the 2023/2024 financial year:

- LRCIP Phase 4 \$472,092 and LRCIP Roads \$272,313
- Roads to Recovery \$537,267
- Regional Road Group \$400,000
- Wheatbelt Secondary Freight Network \$1,216,819
- Regional Bike Network—Spanney and McAndrew Street footpath \$43,275
- Department of Fire and Emergency Services Bushfire Mitigation \$316,939

INFANT HEALTH CENTRE

Council agreed to offer to buy the former Infant Health Centre. The building has been managed and maintained by the Shire of Corrigin since it was built in 1949. It hasn't been used since playgroup moved out in 2017. The shire has no use for the building and it needs quite a lot of work to make it safe.

After some investigation the shire has discovered that the land is still owned by the state government as an unmanaged crown reserve and there is no management order. Since 2019 the shire has been negotiating with the Department Planning, Lands and Heritage to have the land gifted to the Shire of Corrigin at no cost. This was not successful so the shire has decided to buy the land and put it on the market to stimulate the local economy.

COMMUNITY GYM

Council has been looking for a suitable location to set up as a community gym for some time and has considered several options none of which are 100% suitable. The building at 17 Hill Street is currently on the market and is already approved as a public building so may be a good option for a gym. Council resolved to negotiate with the seller to purchase the property and set a maximum price.

CHANGE TO SEPTEMBER COUNCIL MEETING DATE 2023

Council resolved to change the date of the September Council meeting to avoid a clash with the annual Local Government Convention. The Convention is a forum for Elected Members from across the state to discuss important issues facing the sector and hear from a range of interesting guest speakers.

The Ordinary Council Meeting will now be held on Tuesday 26 September 2023 at 3pm.

STRATEGIC COMMUNITY PLAN INTERIM REVIEW

Council reviewed and endorsed the Shire of Corrigin Strategic Community Plan. The plan was developed in 2021 following extensive community consultation and outlines the long term vision and strategic direction for the Shire.

The plan is a guide for the future Shire activities and is to be reviewed every four years with a minor review two years from adoption of the plan.

ARE YOU ELIGIBLE FOR A RATES AND EMERGENCY SERVICES LEVY REBATE FOR YOUR OWNED AND SELF-OCCUPIED PROPERTY?

If you are the holder of a current and valid card below, you may be eligible for a rebate

- Pensioner Concession Card (50% Rebate)
- Commonwealth Seniors Health Card and WA Seniors Card (50% Rebate)
- State <u>Concession Card</u> (50% Rebate)
- WA Seniors Card (25% Rebate)







You may be eligible for a State Government funded Rate Rebate under the provisions of the *Rates and Charges* (*Rebates and Deferments*) *Act 1992* if you are the owner and occupier of that property on the 1st July each financial year.

Applications for these rebates can be made by phoning the Water Corporation on 1300 659 951 or provide an online application via www.watercorporation.com.au.

Please bring your concession cards with you for our verification of your eligibility. The eligibility date will be that of your application lodgement date with either the Shire of Corrigin or the Water Corporation and can not be back dated. 
