### **Local Government Elections** 2023

Local government councillors make many important decisions about the future of your community and we need to have a range of views represented on Council. You can get involved and contribute to the future of your shire by nominating for Council and making decisions about the services to the community such as: recreation buildings; parks and ovals; roads and footpaths; local planning and development and waste management.

Local government ordinary elections are held every two years and the next election will be held on Saturday 21 October 2021. Due to changes to voting system the Shire of Corrigin has asked the WA electoral Commission to run the election this year. Postal voting is also being trialled for the first time.

The Shire of Corrigin has seven Councillors and this year there are four vacancies for a four year term. Meetings are currently held on the third Tuesday of the month at 3pm but the meeting date and time can be changed to suit the majority of Councillors.

Nominations open on 31 August and close at 4.00pm on 9
September 2021. If you are interested in nominating for Council and need more information please give me a call and I would be happy to answer any of your questions.

#### **Swallows at CREC**

Despite attempts to move the swallows on from the Corrigin Recreation and Events Centre they continue to be a major pest. The Department of Biosecurity, Conservation and Attractions has advised that the only remaining legal option is to use a firearm to shoot the pests. An application has been made for a Fauna Damage Licence and once it has been approved arrangements will be made to remove the swallows from building.

The town maintenance team have been pruning, mowing, raking and sweeping in preparation for spring and the Agricultural Show.

### AUGUST 2023 COUNCIL DECISIONS

### LOCAL ROADS AND COMMUNITY INFRASTRUCTURE PROGRAM PHASE 4

In 2020 the Australian Government announced new funding for the Local Roads and Community Infrastructure Program (LRCIP). Eligible projects include construction, maintenance and improvements to council assets that are open to the public. The upgrade to the Corrigin Medical and Wellness Centre and upgrading the pilot activated lights at the airstrip were decided to be priority projects as well as resealing a section of Gill Road and upgrading the floodway on the Wickepin-Corrigin Road.

### VARIATION CONTRACT SUPERVISION OF DRFAWA FIRE AND FLOOD REINISTATEMENT WORK

The Shire of Corrigin submitted two applications for funding under the Disaster Recovery Funding Arrangements Western Australia to repair roads and public assets following the floods in 2021 and the bushfires in 2022. Following a Tender process, Greenfield Technical Services were selected to project manage the funding and works. The approved cost estimate for the management of the project has increased due to the time delay in having the disaster funds approved, due to this increase Council have agreed to a variation of the initial contract.

### REVIEW AND CONTINUATION OF BUILDING SERVICES – CITY OF KALAMUNDA

For the past 11 years the Shire of Corrigin and the City of Kalamunda have maintained a shared services agreement for all regulatory building services within the Shire. Council have endorsed an extension of the agreement for a further three years.

### **SUPPLY AND DELIVERY OF NEW GRADER**

The 2023/2024 Annual Budget included the replacement of the 2012 12M Caterpillar Grader. Submissions from suppliers were requested from WALGA's Preferred Supplier platform with several responses received. The submission that represented the best value for money was from Westrac for a 2023 CAT140 Motor Grader and the trade of the existing machine.

#### SUPPLY AND DELIVERY OF NEW MULTI TYRE ROLLER

The 2023/2024 Annual Budget included the replacement of the 2011 Bomag BW25RH Multityre Roller. Submissions from suppliers were requested from WALGA's Preferred Supplier platform with several responses received. The submission that represented the best value for money was from Westrac for a 2023 CAT CW43 Multityre Roller and the trade of the existing machine.

### **ACCEPTANCE OF BITUMEN TENDER**

Council have accepted a tender from Bitutek Pty Ltd to supply and lay Bitumen Products including aggregate for the next three years for the roads included in the 2023/2024 roads program and the indicative road programs in 2024/2025 and 2025/2026.

### MAIN ROADS HEAVY VEHICLE RAV 7 ACCESS REQUEST

Council was requested by Main Roads WA Heavy Vehicle Services for access to various roads within the Shire to be upgraded to Restricted Access Vehicle (RAV) 7, to allow larger vehicles to utilise these roads. Council have previously adopted a road hierarchy and associated policies and plans to ensure that the road network remains safe for all users as well as ensuring maintenance and renewal work and costs continue to be manageable. Taking this hierarchy into consideration along with the current state and width of roads all requests were supported except for the Wickepin Corrigin Road and Jubuk South Road due to safety concerns. The upgrade to RAV 7 Network access is subject to final inspection and approval by Main Roads.

### LOCAL GOVERNMENT ORDINARY ELECTION CALL FOR NOMINATIONS Shire of Corrigin

An Ordinary Postal Election will be held on Saturday, 21 October 2023 in the Shire of Corrigin to fill the following vacancies:

District 4 Councillors 4 year terms

Nominations Open on Thursday, 31 August 2023 Nominations Close at 4:00pm Thursday, 7 September 2023 Nominations must be lodged with the Returning Officer:

- · at any time during the above period by arrangement; or
- between 2:00pm and 4:00pm Thursday, 7 September 2023 (close of nominations) at the Shire of Corrigin, 9 Lynch Street, CORRIGIN.

### **Nominations Requirements**

Candidates are required to lodge with the Returning Officer:

- a completed nomination in the prescribed form, signed and witnessed. This form is available from the Returning Officer or the Western Australian Electoral Commission (www.elections.wa.gov.au);
- a single A4 page profile of not more than 1,000 characters (including spaces) containing information about the candidate;
- a nomination deposit of \$100 (cash, EFT, bank cheque or postal order);
- · a recent passport-sized photograph (optional);
- every candidate must have completed the online course titled Local Government Candidate Induction, available at <a href="https://www.dlgsc.wa.gov.au">www.dlgsc.wa.gov.au</a>, prior to nominating; and
- (optional) in addition to your A4 profile, you may provide additional information that you consider to be
  relevant to your candidature. This written statement must be not more than 2,000 characters (including
  spaces), must be in the English language and is for publication on the local government's official
  website.

The Commission has developed an online system called Nomination Builder to assist candidates to complete their nomination form which includes the candidate profile. This is the preferred method of completing the nomination form and profile for elections conducted by the Commission. Candidates complete their nomination details and profile, print the completed form which has a reference number allocated and lodge it with the Returning Officer. The nomination builder can be accessed via www.elections.wa.gov.au.

You cannot use Nomination Builder to prepare the additional information.

Where an agent lodges a nomination on a candidate's behalf, it must be in the prescribed form with a written authorisation signed by the candidate.

The documents may be hand delivered or posted to the Returning Officer and must be received by the close of nominations.



### ARE YOU ELIGIBLE FOR A RATES AND EMERGENCY SERVICES LEVY REBATE FOR YOUR OWNED AND SELF-OCCUPIED PROPERTY?

If you are the holder of a current and valid card below, you may be eligible for a rebate

- Pensioner Concession Card (50% Rebate)
- Commonwealth Seniors Health Card and WA Seniors Card (50% Rebate)
- State Concession Card (50% Rebate)
- WA Seniors Card (25% Rebate)







You may be eligible for a State Government funded Rate Rebate under the provisions of the *Rates and Charges* (*Rebates and Deferments*) *Act 1992* if you are the owner and occupier of that property on the 1st July each financial year.

### WHEN ARE WINE BOTTLES ACCEPTED?

- Aluminium wine containers 150ml to 3L are accepted.
- Plastic wine bottles and sachets 150ml to 249ml are accepted.
- Aseptic and cask wine boxes 150ml to 999ml are accepted, and must include both the box and the empty bladder.
- Glass wine bottles and containers smaller than 150ml are never accepted.
- These rules apply for both alcoholic and non-alcoholic wines
- Please remember to remove lids and straws. Separated lids can be returned for recycling. Straws can be disposed of in a general waste bin.




