CEO's Corner

CORRIGIN TOWN HALL

How good does the Corrigin Town Hall look?

The painting of the exterior of the town hall looks amazing and the contractors are doing a fantastic job of preserving this historic building along with the Old Roads Board Building.

After numerous colour samples we nervously chose colours that highlight the grand entry to the hall. I hope you agree she looks very elegant and stands proudly overlooking the street.

I am excited to see the Old Roads Board Building freshly painted soon to match the hall. The large cracks in the building have been repaired and all of the windows restored. Years of sand that has built up around the building and under the floor has been removed and the stumps have been lifted.

The inside wall that was hardly secure has been removed to reveal a beautiful space that the Corrigin Farm Improvement Group staff will be so pleased to occupy in the new year.

BULYEE HALL

Our Building Officer, Kody Broun, has been busy giving the Bulyee Hall a facelift too. The asbestos has been

safely removed from the kitchen area and the walls and ceilings replaced ready for the Bulyee Hall Committee to install new kitchen cupboards, benches and appliances.

OVAL LIGHTS

After a long wait the lights on the football oval have been installed and they are so much better than the old ones. I had a brief look while they were testing the position of the lights and am sure the players will appreciate the improvements.

There has been a delay in the delivery of the hockey oval light poles but they are expected to arrive in the next week or so.

Extra power points will be added to the hockey oval lights which will be a bonus for the Ag Show.

CHRISTMAS LIGHTS

It is hard to believe that Christmas is almost upon us. The Councillors have invited the local seniors to join us on the bus for a tour of town to judge the Christmas lights competition after the council December meeting.

OUT ON THE ROADS

The works crew have been doing great job out on the Quairading Corrigin Road with the bitumen seal booked to go down in mid December.

Unfortunately this work can only be done during summer and we appreciate your patience especially during the busy harvest period.

The crew will move back to the Rabbit Proof Fence Road next and will also finish the shoulder widening on the Bilbarin Quairading Road in the new year.

The team have been keeping up with the maintenance on the roads. Some emergency repairs have been done on the areas that were damaged in the

July floods and we are awaiting approval of funding to repair these areas properly as soon as be can.

Our team have been kept busy patching potholes on rural roads and in town to ensure the roads are safe for all users.

TOWN MAINTENANCE

There seems to be a huge amount of weeds and broken tree branches this year and the town maintenance team have been kept busy mowing, trimming, raking and slashing to keep the town looking great.

Letters have gone out to remind land holders of their responsibilities for reducing flammable material on their land before fines are issued.

POOL

During the off season the pool pumps and filters have been serviced and a non slip surface has been applied to the heated pool deck and bathrooms.

Rachel and Kyla have the water looking beautiful and when the weather warms up I am looking forward to getting back in to do some laps.

OUT AND ABOUT

I attended a meeting in Wandering last week and am off to Perth this week for an Emergency Management course. I am looking forward to joining the Corrigin Police later in the week for the unveiling of their windmill project.

I am excited to see it all finished and I can't wait to see how it has turned out.

November 2021 Council Decisions

CUSTOMER SERVICE CHARTER REVIEW

Council endorsed the revised Customer Service Charter. The charter sets the standard for the Shire of Corrigin's community experience with the services provided by the local government. The charter's aim is to have a positive impact on the Shire of Corrigin's future consultation outcomes and image within the community.

ANIMAL WELFARE IN EMERGENCIES PLAN

Council endorsed the Animal Welfare in Emergencies document as adopted by the Local Emergency Management Committee (LEMC) in November 2021. This document will now be submitted to the District Emergency Management Committee and then State Emergency Management Committee for endorsement.

ROCKVIEW COMMUNITY COPPING PROGRAM

Council revoked their original decision to lease the Rockview cropping land to St John Ambulance Corrigin, as they are no longer able to enter into the lease. The other interested party, Corrigin Farm Improvement Group has now been awarded the lease for a 3 year term.

AUSTRALIA DAY AWARDS

Councillors endorsed the annual Australia Day awards, including Community, Youth and Senior Citizen of the Year and Active Citizenship to be presented at the Australia Day breakfast. Nine nominations were received, however no nominations were received in the Seniors category. Council reviewed the nominations and decided on a winner in each category that will be announced at the Australia Day Breakfast in 2022.

REQUEST TO UPGRADE ROADS TO RAV 7

Council supports the request for the Quairading Corrigin Road from the Shire of Corrigin boundary to Bilbarin Quairading Road to be upgraded to RAV 7.

DISPOSAL OF ASSETS – GLASS CRUSHER

Council authorised the disposal of the Komplet Glass Recycling System Glass Crusher on behalf of the members of RoeROC and will distribute the proceeds among the member Shires of Corrigin, Kondinin, Kulin and Narembeen.

ACCEPTANCE OF QUOTE – SOIL STABILISATION IN SHIRE OF CORRIGIN 2021/22

Council accepted the quote from Western Stabilisers for soil stabilisation on the Rabbit Proof Fence Rd.

LOOK WHAT'S BEEN HAPPENING

TOWN HALL AND OLD ROADS BOARD RESTORATION Over the past few weeks you would have seen the Town Hall exterior undergo a much needed facelift with fresh paint and repairs carried out. Works have now begun on the Old Roads Board Building to paint the same colour as the town hall, fix the external/internal cracking and restore the flooring. These works are funded by Phase 2 of the Local Roads and Community Infrastructure grant. The Town Hall is still available for hire while the external works are being carried out and Corrigin Farm Improvement Group will return to the Roads Board once the restoration has finished.

The aim of the project is to provide a connection between the main highway and the centre of town for people riding, walking, jogging, on gophers and with prams.

It is part of the Shire's ongoing commitment to upgrade the shared pathway network throughout the townsite.

There will be some existing trees removed as part of the section going along Lynch Street, however these will be kept to a minimum and any trees removed will be replaced with a more suitable variety of street tree set back from the new pathway so to avoid any safety issues into the future.




