#### **New Fire Truck**

We were so excited to receive our long awaited new 4x4 fire truck for the Central Volunteer Bushfire Brigade last week. The old truck has given us great service and was certainly well used in our recent fires. The new truck looks very easy for the volunteers to use and has additional safety features that will be a welcome boost to our firefighting capability in the shire.

We will arrange some training on how to use the truck for the brigade later in the year.

#### **Around the Shire**

There is such a lot happening out on the roads in the shire this month and the outside crew have been busy finishing off several projects. The construction program is almost complete with the seals going down on the Corrigin Quairading Road and Rabbit Proof Fence road along with several other reseals. The shoulder widening on the Bullaring Gorge Rock Road is progressing well and is due to be completed later in the month.

Noticeable improvements to town roads include the reseal of Connelly Parade and Hill Street. Adams Street and the road into the cemetery has a new asphalt seal and kerbing which when completed will improve the appearance and drainage of the area.

The ovals have recovered extremely well from earlier in the year and the team are working hard to ensure they in great shape for the sporting season.

In the office it has been all about governance and compliance

lately and the staff have been working with visiting auditors over the past few months to complete interim audits and regulatory requirements.

Preparation for the 2022/2023 budget has already commenced and several Council workshops will be held over the coming months to ensure that the budget is completed for adoption at the July 2022 Council meeting.

#### **Disaster Recovery Funding**

The application for Disaster Recovery Funding WA has been accepted for the fire claim and we hope to commence work very soon on restoring the damaged roads, signs, culverts and bridge guide rails.

The excavator has been working its way around the shire cleaning up the burnt trees from the road verges and is currently on the Corrigin Bruce Rock Road.

The flood claim from last July is still pending and we hope to hear if the claim is successful very soon.

#### **Easter**

I enjoyed a nice break over Easter with family visiting from Busselton and Brisbane. COVID seems to have overshadowed our lives for so long and we all appreciated the relaxation of restrictions that allowed us to spend time with friends and family over the Easter and the school holiday break.

#### **Community Grants Program**

The Long-Term Financial Plan enables local governments to determine their capability to sustainably deliver the key priorities identified for the Strategic Community Plan from consultation with the community early in 2021.

#### **Bushfire Advisory Committee Meeting Recommendations**

The Shire has established and maintained a Bush Fire Advisory Committee in accordance with the *Bush Fires Act 1954* to provide adequate fire protection to the Shire. The Advisory Committee has recommended the Fire Control Officers for 2022/23. April has been a very busy month for the Shire Office and CRC team!

The Shire staff would like to thank you all for contributing to the Bike Plan Survey that was released last month. We were thrilled to receive your response and hear the community's thoughts. Your opinions have all being taken on board and considered for our 10 Year Bike Plan. A reminder that on Tuesday 3 May 2022 at 10:30am there will be a meeting being hosted by Stantech in the CRC Conference Room to verify all the needs outlined in the survey results. There's no need to RSVP everyone is encouraged to turn up and be involved in the future of our bike network planning! We would love for everyone to attend, even if you're not a bike rider come and have your say, everyone's opinions and thoughts are important to the Shire and the community!

Early in April, the Shire hosted the annual Thank a Volunteer sundowner at CREC. Over 50 community members attended and enjoyed delicious refreshments and were recognised for the efforts they put in to make our community a great place to live.

The CRC has been running its exciting school holiday program. The program has been jampacked full of sports days, games, movies, baking, and crafts and was well attended by some very excited and enthusiastic school children.

The CRC has been helping community prepare for COVID by handing out free pulse oximeters, Rapid Antigen Tests (RAT) and masks all provided to our community by the State Government. These items are still available to the community so feel free to pop into the CRC and have one of our lovely staff assist you. The Shire ran its annual ANZAC Day Dawn Service on a rather chilly Monday morning of the 25 April 2022. Approximately 150 gathered at dawn at the R.S.L Memorial Lookout to honour and commemorate those who have served and lost their lives protecting our country. Thank you to those community members who were able to assist on the day to ensure the morning went smoothly.

#### FROM THE WORKS CREW

The key focus for the month of March for the outside crew was the capital roads construction projects, road maintenance, the oval recovery and fire damage recovery.

The roadworks crew have been busy sealing the Rabbit Proof Fence Road and asphalting the Rabbit Proof Fence/Baker and Middleton Road intersection. Shoulder reconditioning has been completed on the Bullaring - Gorge Rock Road, and final seals have been completed on the Corrigin-Quairading Rd, Bendering Road and an asphalt seal to Adams Street including the cemetery's main entrance road.

The crew have also completed maintenance grading on North Jubuk Road; South Jubuk Road, Reed Road, Bartlett Road, and Mooney Road.

In town, the team revamped RSL Memorial Lookout in time for the ANZAC Day service and it is looking lovely. The recovery of the oval from the pump breakdown has gone from strength to strength. The team have put in a lot of work with the support and knowledge of consultants from Lawn Doctor with the irrigation schedules, fertilisation, and mowing program to ensure the already fragile lawn wasn't damaged any further. There is still a lot of work to be done but a maintenance plan has been put in place by our expert consultant and is being followed very closely by the town crew to ensure our oval continues to flourish and our football and hockey teams continue to have excellent playing surfaces.

Work has commenced on the new Bulyee Ablution block with the worksite being cleared ready for the delivery of the new ablutions.

We have farewelled Chris Priest, David Pratt, Paul Watson and Jasmine "Cookie" Poumua from the outside crew since the start of the year. We wish them all luck in their new ventures. On a positive note we are pleased to welcome Damian Whitehead who joined the team after the Easter break as a General Hand, and Paddy Caley will be returning to the Shire as the Leading Hand Parks, Gardens and Town Maintenance in the coming months.

#### **NEW TRUCK FOR CORRIGIN CENTRAL BRIGADE**

Last week the Corrigin Central Bushfire Brigade waved goodbye to their Isuzu 2.4 bushfire truck, that has faithfully served the Corrigin community for over 20 years, to make way for their fabulous new truck supplied by the Department of Fire and Emergency Services (DFES).

The single purpose bushfire fighting appliance is a Volvo 4.4 broad acre appliance is 4 wheel drive and holds 4,000 litres of water. The truck is capable of pumping large amounts of water either through a hydrant or by drawing from bulk water tankers or dams which will make efficiency in the event of a fire much greater! Inside the trucks cab installed are burn over curtains, blankets, and an in-cab air system which all can be operated by the firey's from the interior in the unlikely event that the truck gets caught in a fire with no escape route helping to keep our volunteers safe from harm.

The Corrigin community are very fortunate to have received such a new and innovative truck that will immensely improve the brigades fire fighting capabilities!

#### LOCAL PLANNING POLICY NO.2 DISASTER AND EMERGENCY RECOVERY

Planning and Development Act 2005 Shire of Corrigin

It is hereby notified for public information that the Corrigin Shire Council resolved to adopt the abovementioned local planning policy at its Ordinary Meeting held on 15 March 2022.

This policy, the preparation of which was triggered by the catastrophic bushfires in the Shire in February 2022, aims to build upon existing exemptions in the Shire's local planning framework to ensure development can occur quickly and adapt to community needs. This includes the flexibility to reconstruct damaged or destroyed buildings, structures and associated infrastructure and provide emergency accommodation for people and workers directly affected or engaged during the recovery process.

Following review and endorsement of the policy by the Western Australian Planning Commission on 28 March 2022, the policy now has full legal affect and will be applied by the Shire when dealing with any development that may be required following a disaster or emergency in the Shire's municipal district.


