CEO's Corner

CREC Roof Update

Contractors were back on site this month installing the framework and over sheeting the main roof section. Once the roof is finished and the flashing has been installed the contractors will move on to repairing and replacing the water damage to the inside of the building.

Unfortunately the rain has caused some more leaks into the building while they were working and these have been well documented and are expected to be fixed very soon.

Rotary Park

It seems to rain every time the contractors are back on site at Rotary Park but they have pressed on and installed the two water tanks and irrigation system. The tanks will provide flexibility in watering and options to use both bore water and the recycled water depending on the season and availability.

Kerbing, mulch and soft fall is being installed this week and the plants and turf will arrive very soon. Plans are underway for a grand opening in a couple of months when the weather warms up.

Winter Grading

Well done to the works team who have successfully completed a large capital works program earlier this year which has allowed them to get an early start on the road maintenance program.

The recent rain has provided excellent conditions for winter grading of gravel roads.

The graders have been out on the following roads: Willis, Tipton, Bullaring-Gorge Rock, Corrigin South, Middleton, Whittington, Doyle, Doyle North, Yealering-Kulin, Shipley, Baker, Carruthers, Stretton, Rafferty, Grylls, Jubuk South, Barber, Bulyee-Kweda, Wilson, Corey, Gardener, Dwarlarking, Polkinghorne, Lomos South.

Edging has been conducted on Bendering and Bullaring Pingelly Road.

The team will move across to the south eastern section of the shire to continue grading before moving on through the rest of shire.

Town Maintenance

The rain has kept the town maintenance team busy with weed control and spraying around town on verges, medium strips and footpaths as well as the cemetery, dog cemetery, airstrip and saleyards.

Slashing of various areas has been done including Adventure Park and areas along Walton Street, Dry Well Road, McAndrew Avenue, War Memorial and entry statements.

Street trees have been pruned, new plants have been planted and the oval has been fertilised. The footpaths and streets have been swept and leaves cleaned up after recent rain.

The whole town is looking fantastic and with a quick tidy up it will be all set to look amazing as the weather warms up and we move into spring.

Saleyards

The Department Primary Industries and Regional Development contacted the shire recently about the use of the Corrigin Saleyards to hold sheep for collection by livestock carriers.

A reminder that the Biosecurity and Agriculture Management (Identification and Movement of Stock and Apiaries) Regulation 2013 requires all sheep entering yards to be entered into the National Livestock Identification System (NLIS) database regardless of the time they are in the yards.

Council Elections

Local government ordinary elections are held every two years and the next election will be held on Saturday 21 October 2023 across Western Australia.

Local government councillors make many decisions about the future of your community and it is important to have a range of views represented on Council. You can get involved and contribute to the future of your shire by nominating for Council and making decisions about the services to the community such as: recreation buildings; parks and ovals; roads and footpaths; local planning and development and waste management.

Councillors are elected for four year terms, with half of the Councillors' terms concluding at each biennial election. The Shire of Corrigin has seven Councillors and there are four vacancies in 2023

Meetings are currently held on the third Tuesday of the month at 3pm but the meeting date and time can be changed to suit the majority of Councillors.

Local governments review and update the Owner and Occupier's Roll for their district ahead of the election. If you would like to nominate for Council or vote in the election and are not sure if you are eligible please contact the Shire of Corrigin to check.

Nominations for the October elections open on 2 September and close on 9 September 2023.

Candidates who are elected in 2023 must complete the Council Member Essentials training within 12 months.

JUNE 2023 COUNCIL DECISIONS

DELEGATION REGISTER REVIEW

Local Governments are required to review the delegations to the Chief Executive Officer (CEO) and employees annually. The existing delegations were reviewed and a new delegation was added to assist with timely and efficient decision making for routine town planning matters.

REVISED RECORD KEEPING PLAN

The State Records Act 2000 requires all government agencies to review the Record Keeping Plan and submit it to the State Records Commission for approval at least every five years.

The Shire of Corrigin Record Keeping Plan was reviewed and endorsed by Council.

CONDUCT OF LOCAL GOVERNMENT ELECTION 2023

The recent changes to the Local Government Act 1995 mean that votes in elections are now counted using they optional preferential voting instead of the first past the post system. The changes will be in place for 2023 elections and will make the election count much harder.

Council considered the method of conducting the October 2023 election and decided to contract the WA Electoral Commission (WAEC) to conduct a postal election. Postal elections encourage more people to vote and better represent the whole community. A postal vote is an easy and convenient method of voting increases the response rate. Most the neighbouring shires have elected to use the postal vote method as well.

ROE REGIONAL ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH SCHEME MOU

The Roe Regional Environmental Health Services Scheme (RREHSS) provides an Environmental Health Service to the Shires of Corrigin, Kondinin, Kulin, Narembeen and Lake Grace. The scheme is run by the Shire of Corrigin and employs 1.3 full time equivalent staff.

The existing MOU was reviewed and Council decided to extended the term for another three years from 1 July 2023 and to 30 June 2028.

ROE REGIONAL ORGANISATION OF COUNCILS MOU

The Roe Regional Organisation of Councils (RoeROC) was established in October 2006 to encourage voluntary cooperation and resource sharing between the Shires of Corrigin, Kondinin, Kulin and Narembeen. Council reviewed the existing agreement and agreed to extend it for another three years from 1 July 2023 and to 30 June 2028.

REPORT ON INTERMIN AUDIT FINDINGS

The Shire of Corrigin auditors conducted the interim audit on behalf of the Office of the Auditor General from 1 to 3 May 2023. Council considered the feedback from the Interim Audit findings and noted one finding from the audit that required attention for future compliance. This issue has been addressed and the matter is finalised before the final audit.

RISK MANAGEMENT FRAMEWORK

The Risk Management Framework outlines the Shire of Corrigin's commitment to managing risks that may impact the Shire's strategies, goals and objectives. The framework is reviewed regularly to make sure good decisions are made and roles and responsibilities are clear.



Meetings commence at 3pm in Chambers and interested members of the public are welcome to attend.
