#### SUMMARY

The purpose of this report is to consider and adopt the Shire of Corrigin Budget for the 2018/19 financial year together with supporting schedules, including imposition of rates and minimum payments, adoption of fees and charges, establishment of new reserve funds, setting of elected member's fees for the year and other consequential matters arising from the budget papers.

#### BACKGROUND

Council is required to formally adopt an annual budget to guide the functions and operations of the local government and enable it to raise revenue and deliver services to the community.

#### COMMENT

The draft 2018/19 budget continues to deliver on other strategies adopted by the council and maintains a high level of service across all programs while ensuring an increased focus on road and associated infrastructure as well as on renewing all assets at sustainable levels.

#### **Rates Modelling**

Based on the following:

- Unimproved Values of 139,960,818
- Gross Rental Values of 4,378,536
- Non rateable Values of 191,154
- Average increase in rates of 4%
- Minimum payments for UV and GRV properties of \$390
- Discounted minimum payments of \$273
- Early payment discount of 2%

Fees and charges were adopted separately at the July 2018 Ordinary Council meeting.

#### Concessions

A 30% concession will be available to the owners of minimum rateable properties within the Shire that are rateable on the basis of Gross Rental Value (GRV) and are in the Bilbarin and Bullaring townsites. The purpose of the concession is to recognise the reduced level of service provided to these ratepayers as compared to that of the Corrigin townsite.

#### Allowances

The allowances paid to elected members remains the same as the previous year.

#### Borrowings

There are no new borrowings planned for the 2018/19 financial year. The final payment on the Granite Rise land was paid in July 2018.

#### **Reserve Accounts**

It is proposed that a new Corrigin Recreation and Events Centre Reserve be established for the purpose of future maintenance and capital renewal expenses.

#### **Brought Forward Value**

The opening balance for the 2018/19 is based on a brought forward surplus of \$976,981 as at 30 June 2018. This unaudited figure may change due to adjustments to the opening balance required as part of the auditing process. The brought forward figure includes advance Federal Assistance Grant payments of \$931,278 and ESL grant of \$9,457.50

#### **Capital Works**

A Capital Works budget of \$2,014,353 is proposed in the 2018/19 financial year. The Capital Road Program budget includes \$1,543,453 in road projects with \$864,757 grant funding provided from the following sources: Main Roads Regional Road Group \$341,513 Main Roads Direct Grant \$95,545 Federal Assistance Grant – Roads \$314,882 Roads to Recovery \$112,817

#### STATUTORY ENVIRONMENT

Section 6.2 of the Local Government Act 1995 requires that not later than 31 August in each financial year, or such extended time as the Minister allows, each local government is to prepare and adopt, in the form and manner prescribed, a budget for its Municipal Fund for the financial year ending on the next 30<sup>th</sup> June.

Division 5 and 6 of part 6 of the *Local Government Act 1995* refers to the setting of budgets and the raising of rates and charges. The *Local Government Act (Financial Management) Regulations 1996* details the form and content of the budget.

#### POLICY IMPLICATIONS

The budget is based on the principles outlined in the Shire of Corrigin Strategic Plan, Corporate Business Plan and other related documents.

#### COUNCIL RESOLUTION

For the purpose of yielding the deficiency disclosed by the Municipal Fund Budget adopted at Part A above, council pursuant to sections 6.32, 6.33, 6.34 and 6.35 of the *Local Government Act 1995* impose the following general rates and minimum payments on Gross Rental and Unimproved Values.

Pursuant to Section 6.46 of the *Local Government Act 1995*, council offers a discount of 2% to ratepayers who have paid their rates in full, including arrears, waste and service charges, on or before 15 October 2018 or 35 days after the date of service appearing on the rate notice, whichever is the later.

Pursuant to section 6.45 of the *Local Government Act 1995* and regulation 67 of the *Local Government (Financial Management) Regulations 1996*, council adopts an instalment administration charge where the owner has elected to pay rates (and service charges) through an instalment option of \$10 for each instalment after the initial instalment is paid.

Pursuant to section 6.45 of the *Local Government Act 1995* and regulation 68 of the *Local Government (Financial Management) Regulations 1996*, council adopts an interest rate of 5.5% where the owner has elected to pay rates and service charges through an instalment option.

Pursuant to section 6.51(1) and subject to section 6.51(4) of the *Local Government Act 1995* and regulation 70 of the *Local Government (Financial Management) Regulations 1996*, council adopts an interest rate of 11% for rates (and service charges) and costs of proceedings to recover such charges that remains unpaid after becoming due and payable.

Pursuant to section 6.47 of the Local Government Act 1995 council grant a 30% concession on minimum rateable properties in the Bilbarin and Bullaring townsites in recognition of the reduced level of service in these towns compared to the town of Corrigin.

In previous yours council has offered rate payers who elect payment option 1 (full payment) a 2% discount, as well as being entitled to enter the rate incentive prize draw. Local businesses have donated \$100 towards gift vouchers to be matched by council increasing the value of each voucher to \$200.

Pursuant to the provision section 6.46 of the *Local Government Act 1995*, council grant a discount of 2% and offer the opportunity to enter the draw to win a \$200 voucher (\$100 from council and matched by local businesses) as a rate payment incentive prize for the early payment of any rate or service charge.
