UPDATE

Our beautiful heritage listed Town Hall is in need of major ceiling repairs. Officially opened in 1929, the old girl has seen plenty of good times and created many fond memories over the last 90 years and is now in need of some well deserved TLC.

Parts of the intricate arched ceiling are starting to fall away and the Shire are currently seeking the expertise of a heritage architect and engineer, to assess the scope of works and approval will need to be sought from the State Heritage Council. This specialist restoration work is expected to take a considerable amount of time, well into 2020 and with the interests of community safety a priority.

The Corrigin Town Hall will be closed to the public until further notice.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT EXTRAORDINARY ELECTIONS NOMINATIONS CLOSE 7 NOVEMBER 2019

Nominations are called for the Shire of Corrigin Extraordinary Elections to be held on Saturday 14 December 2019, to fill the following vacancy on the Council of the Shire of Corrigin:

District Two (2) Vacancies Four (4) Year Terms

Nominations for these vacancies open on Thursday 31 October 2019 and close at 4.00pm on Thursday 7 November 2019.

To be eligible to nominate as a candidate you must be an elector of the district (residential or owner/ occupier) and over 18 years of age.

This year it is compulsory for all candidates to complete an online induction prepared by the Department of Local Government available on the website www.dlgsc.wa.gov.au/local-government/local-governments/council-elections/local-government-candidate-induction . You will need to declare that you have completed the online induction when you complete your nomination form.

To nominate as a candidate in the local government election you will need to:

- Complete the online Induction
- Complete and submit a nomination form;
- Supply a candidate profile (150 words maximum);
- Pay a deposit of \$80; and
- Include a recent passport size photograph (optional).

All nomination applications must be signed by the candidate in front of a witness and presented to Natalie Manton, **Returning Officer before 4.00pm on the 7 November 2019. It is recommended that you don't leave it until the last minute** in case any changes are required prior to the close of nominations.

DON'T PLAY RENOVATION ROULETTE! GET TO KNOW ASBESTOS THIS NOVEMBER



Asbestos Awareness Month aims to educate Australians about the dangers of asbestos in and around homes because Australia has one of the highest rates of asbestos-related diseases in the world.

With asbestos-related diseases continuing to increase among Australians as a direct result of exposure to asbestos fibres during home renovations and maintenance, the importance of raising awareness about the dangers of asbestos and how best to manage it in and around homes, cannot be overstated!

During Asbestos Awareness Month 1-30 November we aim to educate as many Australians as possible about the dangers of asbestos and how best to manage it.

Many wrongly believe that ONLY fibro homes contain asbestos. Asbestos products can most likely be found in ANY Australian home built or renovated before 1987 even brick, weatherboard, fibro and clad homes.

Asbestos can be found under floor coverings such as carpets, linoleum and vinyl tiles, behind wall and floor tiles, in cement floors, internal and external walls, ceilings, eaves, garages, around hot water pipes, fences, extensions to homes, outdoor toilets, dog kennels, chook yards and backyard sheds – it could be anywhere!

It's vital that Australians take the warnings seriously, that they stop playing 'renovation roulette' and protect themselves and their families from exposure to asbestos fibres during renovations and maintenance.

Australians need to think smart, think safe, think asbestosawareness.com.au – it's not worth the risk!



ATTENTION PIG FARMERS

African Swine Fever (ASF) has recently been detected in Indonesia and Timor Leste which is only 700km from the Australian Northern Territory coast. ASF is a disease affecting pigs and has crippled pork supplies recently in China and throughout Asia, with 200 million pigs being destroyed in China alone in an effort to control the spread of the disease. Australia does not have ASF – yet – and it is everyone's responsibility especially in farming communities to be on the lookout, as prevention is critical and early detection in the case of a potential outbreak is extremely important.

If ASF was to enter Australia, the most likely route would be through people travelling from affected countries, and bringing in infected pork products, or the virus in dirt on their shoes and clothes.

Therefore it is a timely reminder to all pig farmers or anyone that owns pigs not to feed their pigs with pig swill. Swill is ANY kitchen refuse or scraps fed to pigs.

Food businesses in Corrigin should not be supplying farmers scraps to feed pigs.

CATS AND DOGS

Responsible Pet Ownership

Responsible ownership includes caring for your pet's welfare needs, along with registration, microchipping and adequate confinement to your property.

If you own a dog or a cat, you must:

- Register each dog and cat you own with the Shire of Corrigin
- Keep your dog on a leash when walking it in public
- **Clean up your dog's faeces when walking in public places**
- Keep your dog confined to your property at all other times
- **Make sure your dog doesn't bark persistently**
- **Stop your dog or cat straying onto another person's property**
- Prevent your dog chasing or attacking people or other animals

You can be fined for breaking the law relating to dogs and cats and may also have to pay a release fee if your animals are found wandering and are impounded by Shire.

WHY DO I NEED TO REGISTER MY DOG?

It is required under the *Dog Act 1976* for all dogs over three months of age to be registered with the local government. It's important for both the general community and their dogs that the Shire of Corrigin has a record of dogs and their owners. Registration allows the Shire to provide for better facilities and conditions for responsible dog owners. Your dog is required to wear a collar with a valid registration tag attached. This tag will be issued by the Shire when you pay your registration fee.

The benefits of registration are:

- Positive identification of your dog
- Reuniting lost or injured dogs with their owners
- Investigation and resolution of dog problems
- Encouraging desexing of dogs through discounted registration fees.

The period of dog registration runs from 1 November to 31 October, regardless of when the dog is actually registered. Your dog can be registered for 1 year, 3 years or a lifetime.



Stevenson Scholarship for Further Education **APPLICATIONS NOW OPEN**

The Stevenson Scholarship was established by the late Edna Stevenson (a former resident of the Shire of Corrigin) to promote and advance the education of the residents of the Shire of Corrigin. Stevenson Scholarships are administered by the Trustees of the Edna Stevenson Trust.

Eligibility

Stevenson Scholarships are available to students who are residents of the Shire of Corrigin and/or whose parents or guardians are not able to provide sufficient financial assistance for the student to achieve a tertiary education.

Resident Status

Residents are defined as:

- (a) A person residing in the Shire of Corrigin at the time of applying for the Stevenson Scholarship.
- (b) A former resident of the Shire of Corrigin (of not more than two years absence) who was a student at a school in the Shire of Corrigin for at least three years whose immediate family resides in Corrigin.

Student Status

Students must be enrolled in and attending any of the following:

- (a) Corrigin District High School
- (b) Any government run senior high school in Western Australia
- (c) An agricultural high school or college in Western Australia
- (d) A TAFE college in Western Australia
- (e) A university in Western Australia

Scholarships

Scholarships provide financial assistance to help cover the costs of text books, enrolment fees and course fees at approved educational institutions. The following amounts are indicative

only, lesser or greater amounts may be awarded depending on the course of study and financial need:

- SECONDARY STUDY up to \$2,000
- TERTIARY STUDY up to \$5,000

Scholarships are awarded for one year periods. Scholarship recipients may apply for further scholarships on a year by year basis.
