CEO's Corner

It has been a roller coaster ride over the past month and the Shire has been kept busy responding to the government and health directives due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The focus of our activities have been to keep our staff, community members and emergency service volunteers safe from the virus.

There has been plenty of time spent behind the scenes monitoring information on the emerging situation from trusted government sources, holding meetings to keep everyone up to date and plan how we might respond if COVID-19 was to be in Corrigin. We have also been planning for the recovery phase when we can start to get our lives back to normal once the pandemic is under control.

The COVID-19 situation is like nothing we have ever experienced before and has been very challenging and an extreme test of our resilience. It is inevitable that people have been feeling worried and anxious but it has been very pleasing to see how the Corrigin community has stayed calm and been patient, while providing support to each other over the past month. We will need to continue this support in the coming months.

Out of adversity has come some opportunities and it has been great to see some creative ideas and fun activities popping up around Corrigin lately. We have all missed the connections with people and the social catch ups that are so much a part of rural life. It has been interesting to see people get right out of their comfort zone to learn new skills or use technology in new ways to maintain family and community connections.

The Shire and CRC staff have done an amazing job of keeping you up to date with the latest COVID-19 information and changes to shire services. They have been getting creative and produced video messages, live facebook feeds and offered delivery services. The shire staff are to be congratulated for their amazing ANZAC Day window and display and dawn service video.

The Shire of Corrigin Administration Office doors have re-opened and we will continue to deliver critical services and business as usual wherever possible. Our administration staff have spent the past month working from home and are looking forward to moving back into the office over the next week.

The Community Community Resource Centre, public library, swimming pools and playgrounds remain closed for now but staff are happy to help if you give them a call. We continue to take advice from the Department of Health and government on further actions to reduce the spread of COVID-19.

The outside staff will continue to work on road, building and town maintenance while observing additional hygiene, social distancing and restricting vehicles to one person.

A range of relief measures and new initiatives to support the community and small businesses impacted by COVID-19 were passed at the March Council meeting including:

- Prioritise spending with businesses and contractors located in Corrigin.
- Fortnightly payment terms to support business cash flow.
- Retain existing staff and provide additional casual employment to members of the local community who have lost jobs as a result of business closures.
- Review lease agreements and residential tenancies and considering reductions in rent due to financial hardship.
- Continue existing capital works projects with special COVID-19 precautions if external trades are required.
- Identify capital projects that can be accelerated.
- Suspend legal action for debt collection and offer payment arrangements for unpaid rates and general debtors.
- Refund fees for cancelled bookings.
- Waive or refund winter sport fees.
- Promote community grants.
- Promote external funding and grant opportunities making applications where applicable.
- Identify and contact vulnerable people in community.

These community support initiatives will reduce the revenue from rates, fees and charges and will require careful analysis of expenditure, to ensure critical services are delivered.

The Council also resolved to develop the 2020/21 budget based on a zero percent increase in rates and fees and charges. This will mean that the total rates income will remain the same as last year but there will still be variation of individual properties due to the impact of the valuations from the Valuer General which show a 3% increase in the value of rural properties over the past year.

In the coming months Council will consider a range of community projects in the recovery phase to increase community connections including community, sport, arts and cultural initiatives.

We are excited to welcome ten short term casual staff members to our team this week. The team will join the outside staff in a range of town and road maintenance projects and we look forward to seeing the place sparkle with this extra help.



COVIDSafe app

Stop the spread of coronavirus by downloading the new voluntary app, COVIDSafe.

This app is recommended by the Chief Medical Officer and will help keep you, your family, and your community safe.

Downloading COVIDSafe will mean that you know quickly if you've been in contact with someone who has tested positive for the virus. We need as many Australians as possible to download the app.

The more people who download COVIDSafe will mean that we can control the spread of the virus and start easing some of the restrictions we have had to put in place.

Information through the app will only be accessible to state and territory health officials. Any other access or use will be a criminal offence.

The app will only keep contact information for 21 days. Once the pandemic is over, and the app is no longer needed, the app and all its data will be deleted permanently. No virus, no app.

Drought Community Support Initiative

The Salvation Army is delivering assistance through the Australian governments Drought Community Support Initiative (DCSI – Round 2). The second round of this assistance commenced on 21 November 2019.

If you are a farmer, farm worker, farm supplier or farm contractor who is doing it tough due to the drought you may be eligible for a one off payment of up to \$3,000.

To be eligible you need to be:

- Over the age of 18 years
- Be an Australian citizen or permanent resident
- Live and / or work in the Shire of Corrigin
- Have not already received this payment from The Salvation Army or St Vincent de Paul since 21 Nov 2019

The maximum amount a household can receive is \$3,000. If more than one eligible household members reside in the same residence, the total assistance provided to the household cannot exceed \$3,000.

You can apply for the drought assistance online at www.salvationarmy.org.au/drought (preferred method) or by calling the 24/7 Telephone Assistance Line on 1300 551 030. If your preferred method is to call the Telephone Assistance Line, please only use this line to make a new application and please leave a voice message with all the information requested.

The Salvation Army has distributed over \$28million of this funding to over 9,900 drought affected households since 21 November 2019, and as at 31 March 2020 were distributing over \$1.2million every three days. As you would appreciate, demand for this assistance has been high.

The Salvation Army will call you to complete your assessment as soon as they can. Please do not make a second application if you have already applied as they will get to you.

The payment is not considered taxable income. If you had assistance in DCSI(Round 1) which concluded on 30 June 2019 you are eligible to apply for assistance for DCSI(Round 2).
