Road Funding Bonus

The CEO, Manager of Works and Leading Hand Construction attended a workshop for local governments involved in the Wheatbelt Secondary Freight Network Project Stage 1 Priority Projects on Thursday 3 September 2020 at Jurien Bay. The Shire of Corrigin recently received confirmation that the Rabbit Proof Fence has been approved for \$2.5m funding in the coming year. The purpose of the meeting was to understand the road design standards and expectations as well as the indicative budget and technical aspects of the project. Following the meeting a site inspection was held on the Jurien East Road Project to gain an appreciation of the magnitude of the scope and plant that will be required for future projects.

Last week I travelled through the northern wheatbelt back roads to see a picture of wildflowers and beautiful crops, but the outstanding exhibit was a line of Wreath Flowers on the side of the road between Goodlands and Wubin.



Sign Up today for a WA Containers for Change Scheme ID

The roll-out of the WA Containers for Change Scheme is fast approaching, and as of the 1st October 2020 you can receive a 10c refund for your eligible containers!

To receive your refunds electronically; simply sign up for a scheme ID, nominate a bank account, and the refund will be deposited via electronic funds transfer (EFT) when you quote your ID number at the drop-off point!

Refunds of cash will be available at the Corrigin Refund Point from Saturday 17th October 2020 for up to \$20 (200) containers in one transaction.





Dog and Cat Registrations are now due...

Don't forget that all dogs and cats must be registered with your local Shire. In addition to avoiding potential fines, registered pets can be more quickly reunited with their owners if they become lost. If you haven't already done so, call into the Shire office to pay your pet registration fees. All pets must be registered before 31 October 2020.

- Under the Dog Act 1976, all dogs over 3 months of age must be microchipped and registered before 31 October. Your dog will be required to wear a collar and registration tag, to ensure easy identification and return to you if they become lost.
- Under the Cat Act 2011, all cats over the age of 6
 months of age must be sterilised, microchipped and
 registered before 31 October. Your cat will be required
 to wear a collar & registration tag, to ensure easy
 identification and return to you if they become lost.

- Proof of sterilisation along with microchipping details must be presented when registering your pet(s)
- On the spot fines can be issued for failing to register, microchip or sterilise your pet(s)
- On the spot fines of \$100 per offence can be issued for noncompliance under the "Acts".

Stevenson Scholarship for further education

APPLICATIONS NOW OPEN

The Stevenson Scholarship was established by the late Edna Stevenson (a former resident of the Shire of Corrigin) to promote and advance the education of the residents of the Shire of Corrigin. Stevenson Scholarships are administered by the Trustees of the Edna Stevenson Trust.

Eligibility

Stevenson Scholarships are available to students who are residents of the Shire of Corrigin and/ or whose parents or guardians are not able to provide sufficient financial assistance for the student to achieve a tertiary education.

Resident Status

Residents are defined as:

- (a) A person residing in the Shire of Corrigin at the time of applying for the Stevenson Scholarship.
- (b) A former resident of the Shire of Corrigin (of not more than two years absence) who was a student at a school in the Shire of Corrigin for at least three years whose immediate family resides in Corrigin.

Student Status

Students must be enrolled in and attending any of the following:

- (a) Corrigin District High School
- (b) Any government run senior high school in Western Australia
- (c) An agricultural high school or college in Western Australia
 (d) A TAFE college in Western
- (d) A TAFE college in Western Australia
- (e) A university in Western Australia

Scholarships

Scholarships provide financial assistance to help cover the costs of text books, enrolment fees and course fees at approved educational institutions.

The following amounts are indicative only, lesser or greater amounts may

be awarded depending on the course of study and financial need:

- SECONDARY STUDY
 up to \$2,000
- TERTIARY STUDY up to \$5,000

Scholarships are awarded for one year periods. Scholarship recipients may apply for further scholarships on a year by year basis.

Auspire - Australia Day Council WA presents the Community Citizen of the Year

Your local government invites you to nominate an outstanding individual or group for one of this year's Community Citizen of the Year Awards to be presented on Australia Day 26 January. The awards foster, recognise and celebrate significant contributions to community life and active citizenship in all local government areas of Western Australia. His Excellency the Governor of Western Australia is the Patron and signatory for the awards.

Guidelines and criteria

Each year three local citizens and one local community group in each local government area will be eligible for the Community Citizen of the Year Awards. The recipients will be selected from people and groups who have made a noteworthy contribution during the current year or given outstanding service to the local community over a number of years through active involvement.

Auspire - Australia Day Council WA provides four awards each year for presentation in each local government area. These prestigious awards are provided to your local government for presentation during Australia Day celebrations.

Nomination Process

Your local government invites nominations for the awards from community groups and private citizens. At the council's discretion, a committee comprised of people from community organisations and citizens, will be appointed to encourage and promote nominations. The committee or your local council may also make nominations based on local knowledge and experience.

Nominations open on 1 September and close on 31 October and can be received in hard copy on the original nomination form or online at www.citizenshipawards.com.au.

Nominations received after the closing date will be ineligible for this year's awards.

The four award categories

Community Citizen of the Year Community Citizen of the Year (Senior) Community Citizen of the Year (Youth) Active Citizen Award (Group or Event)

Selection Criteria

The winners will have been judged to have shown active citizenship and:

- Significant contribution to the local community.
- Demonstrated leadership on a community issue resulting in the enhancement of community life.
- A significant initiative which has brought about positive change and added value to community life.
- Inspiring qualities as a role model for the community.

Eligibility criteria

- Nominees should reside or work principally within the local authority making the award.
- Awards may be granted posthumously in recognition of recent achievements.
- Groups of people or couples will not normally be eligible except when meeting the criteria for a community group.
- A person may receive an award on more than one occasion in recognition of their particularly outstanding community contribution or involvement in an alternative initiative.
- Unsuccessful nominees may be nominated in future years.
- Nominations must be apolitical in their nature and should not in any way bring the awards program or local government area into disrepute.
- Sitting members of State, Federal and Local Government are not eligible.
