## Council Elections

Local government ordinary elections are held every two years and the next election will be held on Saturday 16 October 2021 across Western Australia.

Local government councillors make many important decisions about the future of your community and we need to have a range of views represented on Council.

You can get involved and contribute to the future of your shire by nominating for Council and making decisions about the services to the community such as: recreation buildings; parks and ovals; roads and footpaths; local planning and

development and waste management.

Councillors are elected for four year terms, with half of the Councillors' terms concluding at each biennial election.

The Shire of Corrigin has seven Councillors and there are four vacancies in 2021. Meetings are currently held on the third Tuesday of the month at 3pm but the meeting date and time can be changed to suit the majority of Councillors.

Local governments review and update the Owner and Occupier's Roll for their district ahead of the election. If you would like to nominate for Council or vote in the election and are not sure if you are eligible please contact the Shire of Corrigin to check.

Nominations for the October elections open on 2 September and close at 4:00pm on 9 September 2021.

Candidates who are elected in 2021 must complete the Council Member Essentials training within 12 months, i.e. by 16 October 2022. The training is valid for five years, so current council members who are re-elected in 2021 are not required to undertake the training again, unless they have not yet completed all five modules of the training per the requirements of the Local Government Act.

# NEWS FROM COUNCIL

## Repeal Corrigin War Memorial Swimming Pool Local Law

Over the past few years the shire has been reviewing the Local Laws and repealing those that are no longer relevant. The Shire of Corrigin by-laws relating to the Corrigin War Memorial Swimming Pool were gazetted on in November 1962. The purpose of the local law was to give the Pool Manager certain powers, enforce rules within the pool enclosure and enforce a dress code while within the pool. It also provided for the authority to charge admission fees to the pool.

Due to the various changes to legislation and the passing of time this local law is now redundant and most matters included in the local law are now governed by the *Local Government Act 1995*, *Public Health Act 2016* or through policies and procedures.

The process of repealing a local law is the same process as if a local government was making a local law. Once the community consultation phase is completed and feedback from the Minister is received these will be considered by Council before proceeding to make the new local law to effectively remove the old local law.

## Community Grants

Council considered seven applications from community groups for financial support towards projects or events in the 2021/22 financial year at the April meeting. Community and sporting groups will soon receive a letter advising whether the application for funding or in kind support was endorsed by Council with the final confirmation to be made when the annual budget is adopted in July 2021.

## New Grader

Council considered the tenders received for the replacement of the 2009 Volvo grader at the April meeting and accepted the quote from Westrac to purchase the CAT 140 L3 model. While the overall price from Westrac was higher than both AFGRI Equipment and Komatsu Australia, the specifications, serviceability, warranty and efficiency of the machine were rated highly in the evaluation process.

The CAT graders have been reliable and the service and support has been excellent. Currently the Shire has two CAT graders of the same model in the fleet and purchasing a third will ensure efficiency with replacement parts, servicing and training staff to operate the machine.

Council decided to accept the price from WA Machinery Brokers to purchase the 2009 Volvo grader outright rather than trade it on the new grader.

## Oval Lights

The Shire of Corrigin called tenders for the upgrade of the lighting at Corrigin Recreation Precinct with two separate components including:

1. To upgrade the existing Corrigin Australian Football League (AFL) sports lighting with LED lights to meet the relevant Australian Standards (100 Lux)
2. The installation of a new LED sports lighting system to the Corrigin Hockey Oval that also met the required standard (250 Lux).

Three tenders were received and after a thorough and detailed evaluation GreenLite Electrical Contractors were awarded the tender based on:

- a price within the budget allocation,
- most recent experience of works with a similar scope,
- qualifications and experience of all relevant staff,
- plant and equipment, contingency measures and safety record, and
- current work commitments with deadlines of completion dates.

## Wheatbelt Secondary Freight Network

Council endorsed the Shire of Corrigin's commitment to the Wheatbelt Secondary Freight Network (WSFN) which comprises approximately 4,400km of local government managed roads across 53 routes connecting with State and National highways to provide access for heavy vehicles across the region. The network consists of 42 local governments in the Wheatbelt region who have worked collaboratively for over four years to identify and secure \$187 million of Federal, State and Local Government funding to improve secondary freight network routes on local government roads in the Wheatbelt. The funding break-down for each project is 80% Federal Government, 13.3% State Government and 6.7% Local Government.

The Shire of Corrigin has already commenced preliminary work on the Priority 1 project on the Rabbit Proof Fence Road and is awaiting confirmation of funding for the Corrigin Bruce Rock Road as a Priority 2 project.

Adjustments will be required to the 10 year road program and reallocate funds to WSFN instead of Regional Road Group funding as required.
