The President, Des Hickey and I formally congratulated and thanked Tomo for his long and loyal service to the shire and Corrigin community before handing over to staff for some informal stories and well wishes.

During the evening messages were read from former CEO, Bruce Mead and Heather Talbot who were not able to attend the event.

Tomo will take some well earned leave over the next few weeks before his official retirement at the end of the month.

The new manager of works, Mr Phil Burgess, will be in Corrigin for a hand over next week before his official start date on 1 July 2021.

### Container Deposit Scheme

Now that the Container Deposit Scheme is up and running in Corrigin it would be great to see more recycling of containers for the community and the environment benefit from this excellent fundraising opportunity.

Local sporting clubs and community groups can raise funds for new equipment or expenses by collecting 10 cents for recycling cans and bottles.

With football and hockey finals in the next few months, along with the Agricultural Show and the wildflower season, it is a good time to start thinking about how your club or group can use the Containers for Change refunds to boost your bank account.

### **Promoting Corrigin**

The WA Local Government Association (WALGA) has been working their way around the state creating short videos showcasing the work that local councils do and the wide impact they have on everyday life

The website <u>youreveryday.com.au</u> shows how local governments are involved in so many day-to-day aspects of our lives and introduces us to the people behind the scenes that deliver the many services that local governments provide.

The President Des Hickey, Councillors and I welcomed Jeff Henderson from WALGA last week and assisted him with some photos and videos of our shire. Jeff has visited most towns in the state and was impressed with the appearance of our town and friendly local people.

We are looking forward to seeing the video and sharing it with the community when it is available in the next few months.

### Strategic Community Plan

The Shire of Corrigin Community Strategic Plan consultation has concluded, with over 120 people completing the surveys and helping to shape the shire's priorities for the next 10 years.

The comments and ideas collected during the consultation process will be used to develop a draft Community Strategic Plan which will be released for further community feedback before it is endorsed by Council.

### We have Been Busy

We have been busy finishing off many projects as the end of the financial year comes to a close. Almost \$6million of capital works have been completed since July 2020 and there is more to come in 2021 -22.

Two new aged housing units are finished and will be handed over to the Corrigin Senior Citizen's Committee after the official opening next week.

The new ablution block at the Corrigin Caravan Park was officially handed over to Trevor and Mareese Dyer last month and is receiving excellent reviews from travellers.

The large road construction program has been completed and the outside crew have moved on to the maintenance of our road network.

We have reconstructed approximately 5km on Bendering Road, 3.5km on Corrigin Quairading Road and 2km on Bullaring Pingelly Road as well as widened the shoulders on 3.5km of the Babakin Corrigin Road. We sealed almost 8km of bitumen and improved our footpath on Hill Street.

Over the next few months the outside staff will take some well earned leave and the machinery will be serviced ready for new construction projects starting in July.

Preliminary work has commenced on the Rabbit Proof Fence Road which will see improvements on this important freight route over the next five years.

Meanwhile the inside staff have been finalising accounts for the end of the financial year and working on the budget for 2021/22.

# May 2021 Council Decisions

# Work to Commence at Rotary Park

The tender for phase 1 of the Rotary Park Redevelopment was recently approved by Council and we look forward to receiving the preliminary design and construction plans for the new toilet block, entry statement and landscaping based on the concept plan developed by Nature Play Solutions.

### Proposed Local Law - Dogs

As no public submissions were received Council resolved to make the Shire of Corrigin Dog Local Law 2021. Preparation is underway to publish it in the Gazette. Details can be found on the Shire of Corrigin website.

### Infant Health Centre

The Infant Health Centre building has been managed and maintained continuously since its construction in 1949 by the Shire of Corrigin. The building now requires quite extensive maintenance, an upgrade of the electrical wiring and replacement of the ceiling in order to enable the building to be used.

The Shire of Corrigin has become aware that the land is actually an unmanaged Crown Reserve for the purpose of infant health and is not the subject of a management order. Council has resolved to request that the State gift the former Infant Health Centre to the Shire of Corrigin or offer the property for sale at a significantly discounted price.

Native Title Settlement – Noongar Heritage Agreement Council considered the South West Native Title Settlement Template Noongar Heritage Agreement and noted that it is a complicated document and may not be suited to small local governments.

The Council agreed that there is no need to consider entering into any agreements until the Noongar Regional Corporations have been established and the proposed Aboriginal Cultural Heritage Bill has been enacted.

### RV Overnight Stay

Council endorsed a proposal to seek accreditation as a Recreational Vehicle (RV) Friendly Town with Campervan and Motorhome Club of Australia Limited (CMCA) and designate four locations across the shire as suitable for recreational vehicles.

Shire staff will meet soon to make plan to allow fully self-contained recreational vehicles to park for free, for up to 48 hours, on the portion of Reserve 47959 Walton Street Corrigin.

More information will be provided once details have been finalised.

### Selling Agency Agreement Granite Rise Estate

It is exciting to see four new houses in the Granite Rise Estate over the past year. During April and May the Shire of Corrigin invited Expressions of Interest from local and regional real estate agents for the sale of lots in the Granite Rise Estate over the next three years.

At the recent meeting, Council endorsed the selling agency agreement for the sale of vacant land in the Corrigin with Steve Wright from Nutrien Harcourts for a three year period.

# Amalgamation of Murphy Street Lots

Council considered a proposal to amalgamate 3 to 5 Murphy Street (Lot 446 and 447) Corrigin to facilitate the redevelopment of the Corrigin Wellness Centre and resolved to commence the application process for the issuing of a single title.

The existing Medical Centre and Wellness Centre share a common roof and the building currently straddles the common boundary between Lots 446 and 447. The lots were not amalgamated when the previous upgrade was done to the Corrigin Medical Centre and plans to renovate and extend the Wellness Centre are limited if the titles remain separate.

# Development Application Approved

Council granted conditional approval to a development application received from Evoke Living Homes for a proposed new single house on Lot 16 Price Retreat, Corrigin.

# Addition to Fees and Charges 2020/2021


Recently a road construction company approached Council staff in regards to accessing water from the Bulyee water tanks for their project. Three water tanks were installed by the Shire when the Bulyee Road reconstruction project commenced several years ago and the water is pumped to these tanks from the well nearby.

The Shire of Corrigin fees and charges are set by Council annually and there was a need to set a charge for the supply of underground water that is not supplied by Water Corporation.

This new charge of \$2 per kilolitre will be included in the Schedule of Fees and Charges for the 2020/21 financial year effective as of 18 May 2021 and will be reviewed as part of the annual budget adoption.

# Stevenson Scholarship for Further Education

# APPLICATIONS NOW OPEN

The Stevenson Scholarship was established by the late Edna Stevenson (a former resident of the Shire of Corrigin) to promote and advance the education of the residents of the Shire of Corrigin. Stevenson Scholarships are administered by the Trustees of the Edna Stevenson Trust.

# Eligibility

Stevenson Scholarships are available to students who are residents of the Shire of Corrigin and/or whose parents or guardians are not able to provide sufficient financial assistance for the student to achieve a tertiary education.

# **Resident Status**

Residents are defined as:

- (a) A person residing in the Shire of Corrigin at the time of applying for the Stevenson Scholarship.
- (b) A former resident of the Shire of Corrigin (of not more than two years absence) who was a

student at a school in the Shire of Corrigin for at least three years whose immediate family resides in Corrigin.

# Student Status

Students must be enrolled in and attending any of the following:

- (a) Corrigin District High School
- (b) Any government run senior high school in Western Australia
- (c) An agricultural high school or college in Western Australia
- (d) A TAFE college in Western Australia
- (e) A university in Western Australia

# **Scholarships**

Scholarships provide financial assistance to help cover the costs of text books, enrolment fees and course fees at approved educational institutions.

The following amounts are indicative only, lesser or greater amounts may be awarded depending on the course of study and financial need:

- SECONDARY STUDY up to \$2.000
- TERTIARY STUDY up to \$5,000

Scholarships are awarded for one year periods. Scholarship recipients may apply for further scholarships on a year by year basis.




